

What is College Credit Plus?



- Established to enhance students' college and career readiness and success.
- 7th 12th grade students are eligible.

4 Steps for College Credit Plus

Expectations of a College Credit Plus Student



Being "college-ready" is more than just being prepared academically.

- Consider the emotional and social transition necessary to be successful in the college environment.
- Consider the time management, organizational, and communication skills necessary to succeed in credit-bearing college coursework.
- Self-advocacy is essential. CCP students are responsible for their own communication between faculty and advisors.

CCP Considerations



Grade Weighting and Graduation Requirements


- College Credit Plus courses are weighted using the same scale as Advanced Placement.
- Students may take College Credit Plus courses in subject areas that will satisfy graduation requirements.
- Students should work with their school counselor to confirm how CCP courses will count.

Credit Transferability



- General education and technical courses should transfer
 - Ohio public college to another Ohio public college
- Students should confirm with future colleges about transferability
- Check https://transfercredit.ohio.gov for more transfer information

Consequences of Underperforming



 By default, grades are permanently recorded on high school and college transcripts and will be factored into each GPA.




Consequences of Underperforming



- Students are at risk for CCP Probation when they either:
 - Earn lower than a 2.0 cumulative GPA in College Credit Plus courses.
 - Withdraw from or receive no credit for two or more courses in the same term.
- While on CCP probation, the student:
 - May only enroll in one CCP course for the semester.
 - May not enroll in a college course in the same subject in which the student previously earned a D, F, or received no credit.
- MND will determine a CCP student's probation status.

Expenses/Tuition



- All non-public students must apply for CCP funding each academic year via OHID. Application opens each February and closes April 1 at 5:00 PM.
 - Funding is awarded in terms of college credit hours.
 - One semester long course is typically 3 credit hours
 - Students who wish to take more than their awarded hours may pay out of pocket for the tuition, fees and books associated with the course.
- Participation in the CCP program does not reduce MND tuition obligations.

How Many Hours Can Students Enroll In?



- The maximum number of credits allowable for a student while participating in the CCP program is 120.
 - Non-public students may be limited by amount of funding hours awarded.
- College campus courses may be limited by the MND schedule:
 - Students may request an additional merit time in their schedule to make this work please see Mr. Hunt to determine if this is feasible.
- CCP courses cannot count towards their required Religion courses per the Archdiocese.

Course Eligibility Rules



Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses, which include:

- Transferable courses
- Courses in IT, Computer Science, Anatomy & Physiology, Foreign Language
- Courses that are part of a technical certificate
- Courses that are part of a 15- or 30-credit pathway
- Courses in study skills, and academic or career success

Course Eligibility Rules



Non-allowable courses include:

- Private applied courses with one-on-one instruction (such as performing art lessons)
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- Pass/Fail graded courses
- Remedial courses or sectarian/religious courses

MND Faculty Access



Empowering Young Women

 MND faculty and staff may only advise students on MND coursework.

 CCP students who need/want additional support for their CCP coursework should seek help through the college resources and office hours for the assigned professor.

Testing Note:

You must have an unweighted 3.0 GPA at MND. You may need to take a placement test depending on the CCP course you are interested in taking.





- 1. Transcript Request is sent to high school counselor automatically.
- 2. Check your email for next steps

Eligibility and College Readiness

Requirements are set by the State

- 3.0 GPA
- 2.75 GPA
 - If admitted with a 2.75 GPA you can only take classes in which you have earned an A or a B in relevant coursework- any student who applies with below a 3.0 will be asked to take our placement before being admitted with the restrictions)
- ACT subscores in English: ≥18 and Reading: ≥22
- SAT Evidence Based Reading & Writing: 480+
- Accuplacer Scores: 250 Reading and 5 Writing
 - If you do not have the required GPA you will receive an email to sign up for our Accuplacer test.
 - Math test required for Math Placement not Admission



WHAT IS COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS?

- College Credit Plus (CCP) is a state supported program.
- Established to enhance students' college and career readiness and success.
- 7th 12th grade students are eligible.
- Earn both high school and college credit upon successful completion of coursework.

BENEFITS OF PARTICIPATING IN CCP

- Opportunity to explore potential career paths, majors, degrees, and/or certificates.
- Experience college early to manage the expectations of college life.
- Potential tuition and textbook cost savings.

EXPECTATIONS OF A COLLEGE-READY CCP STUDENT

Being "college-ready" is more than just being prepared academically.

- Consider the emotional and social transition necessary to be successful in the college environment.
- Consider the time management, organizational, and communication skills necessary to succeed in credit-bearing college coursework.
- Self-advocacy is essential. CCP students are responsible for their own communication between faculty and advisors.

CCP CONSIDERATIONS

Grade Weighting and Graduation Requirements

- If a high school uses a weighted grading scale for Advanced Placement,
 International Baccalaureate, or Honors courses in a subject area, then College Credit Plus courses in that subject area will be weighted using the same scale.
- Students may take College Credit Plus courses in subject areas that will satisfy graduation requirements
- Students must work with school counselors to confirm how CCP courses may count toward their weighted GPA, and to ensure they are meeting any remaining high school graduation requirements.

CCP CONSIDERATIONS: NOTICE OF MATURE CONTENT

From Ohio Revised Code: Section 3365.035 | Course mature subject matter disclaimer

"The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs."

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES OF UNDERPERFORMING?

- Financial consequences may arise if students do not earn a passing grade or if they withdraw too late from college courses (district may require students/ families to reimburse the tuition that the district had paid).
- By default, grades are permanently recorded on high school and college transcripts and will be factored into each GPA.

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES OF UNDERPERFORMING?

- Students are at risk for CCP Probation when they either:
 - Earn lower than a 2.0 cumulative GPA in College Credit Plus courses.
 - Withdraw from or receive no credit for two or more courses in the same term.
- While on CCP probation, the student:
 - May only enroll in one CCP course for the semester.
 - May not enroll in a college course in the same subject in which the student previously earned a D, F, or received no credit.
- Secondary schools are responsible for determining a CCP student's probation status.

WHAT ARE THE EXPENSES FOR COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS?

- Non-public students must apply for College Credit Plus funding every year.
- For all CCP students who EXCEED their credit hour enrollment limit, there will be costs incurred to the student/families for tuition (rate at the campus of enrollment), required fees and textbooks.
- Some optional expenses are the responsibility of the student/family (Examples: Parking and transportation).

WHAT ARE THE EXPENSES FOR COLLEGE CREDIT PLUS?

- Non-public and Home school students must apply for CCP funding each academic year.
 Application opens each February and closes April 1.
- Funding Year runs Summer, Fall, and Spring.
- Funding is awarded in terms of college credit hours.
 - One semester long course is typically 3 credit hours
- Students who wish to take more than their awarded hours may pay out of pocket for the tuition, fees and books associated with the course under "Option A" of CCP.

HOW MANY HOURS CAN STUDENTS ENROLL?

 Non-public and home school students may be limited by amount of funding hours awarded.

 The maximum number of credits allowable for a student while participating in the CCP program is 120.

Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses, which include:

- Transferable courses
- Courses in IT, Computer Science, Anatomy & Physiology, Foreign Language
- Courses that are part of a technical certificate

ACCESSIBILITY RESOURCES

- The Accessibility Resources Offices at UC provides appropriate accommodations or other specialized services for students with documented disabilities.
- Student To-Do List:
 - Register with UC's Accessibility Resource Office
 - Come prepared with current documentation that meets university guidelines
 - Request accommodations prior to taking scheduled placement tests, etc.
 - Ask yourself these questions:
 - Do I need things like counseling, medication management, or other supports not provided through UC?
 - Who will provide them for me?
 - How will this affect my schedule?

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

On Campus/Online Admission Requirements:

Students must meet **one** of the following criteria to be considered to take courses on campus or online with a UC faculty member:

- •3.0 unweighted high school GPA
- •2.75-2.99 unweighted high school GPA and
 - "B" grade or better in a least one high school English course <u>and</u>
 - "B" grade or better in a least one high school math course
- •ACT 18 ENGL/22 MATH or SAT- 480 EBRW/530 MATH (If using ACT/SAT to meet eligibility criteria, official scores must be sent to UC directly from ACT/SAT)

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

In High School Admission Requirements:

Students must meet <u>one</u> of the following criteria to be considered to take CCP courses in their high school (only for high schools with which UC has a <u>partnership</u>):

- •3.0 unweighted high school GPA
- •2.75-2.99 unweighted high school GPA and
 - "B" grade or better in a relevant high school course
- •ACT 18 ENGL/22 MATH or SAT- 480 EBRW/530 MATH (If using ACT/SAT to meet eligibility criteria, official scores must be sent to UC directly from ACT/SAT)

APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Online application available at www.uc.edu/ccp
 - Application for Summer and Fall 2024 is available **soon.** Deadline to apply is **March 15, 2024**.
- 2. Official High School Transcripts
 - Sent directly from the school
- CCP Permission Slip (PDF can be signed and uploaded to application portal or completed electronically)

APPLICATION DEADLINES

 Intent form due April 1 to HS counselors (Included in the funding application for Nonpublic and Homeschool students).
